THE EUROPEAN UNION

The European Union (EU) is a political and economic union of 28 member states that are located primarily in Europe. The EU has developed an internal single market through a standardized system of laws that apply in all member states. EU policies aim to ensure the free movement of people, goods, services, and capital within the internal market, enact legislation in justice and home affairs, and maintain common policies on trade, agriculture, fisheries, and regional development. A monetary union was established in 1999 and came into full force in 2002, and is composed of 19 EU member states which use the euro currency.

The European Union provides more foreign aid than any other economic union. Covering 7.3% of the world population, the EU in 2016 generated a nominal gross domestic product (GDP) of 16.477 trillion US dollars, constituting approximately 22.2% of global nominal GDP. Additionally, 27 out of 28 EU countries have a very high Human Development Index, according to the United Nations Development Programme. In 2012, the EU was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. Through the Common Foreign and Security Policy, the EU has developed a role in external relations and defence. The union maintains permanent diplomatic missions throughout the world and represents itself at the United Nations, the World Trade Organization, the G7, and the G20 Summits. Because of its global influence, the European Union has been described as an emerging superpower.

OVERALL

1. Research your region. How has the map changed? What influenced those changes?
2. Collect information about 4-6 different events, people, places, etc and make each one a different “stop”.
3. Find a place on the map to signify each stop.
4. Collect information, pictures and/or videos for each stop. Place this on a shared Google Doc for you and your partner.
5. Once you have collected all needed information, start creating your Google Tour. See the slideshow for step by step help.
6. Remember the last “stop” needs to be a summary of the impact of the SPICE elements in the region. The location of this stop can be anywhere in your region.

QUESTIONS TO ASK WHILE RESEARCHING

1. What significant events, people or places impacted the geography of the region?
2. How has the region changed?
3. How has the region stayed the same?
4. What location on the map could represent the war, treaty, person, battle failure or success of the government etc.?
5. How have these significant events, people, places, etc. impacted the SPICE elements of the region?
6. How do changes in a map, or changes in political borders, impact the people, culture, government and/or economics of the region?

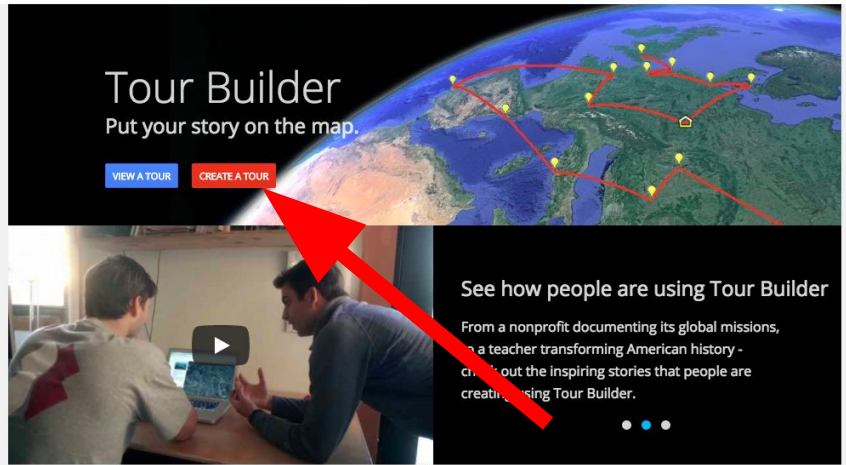

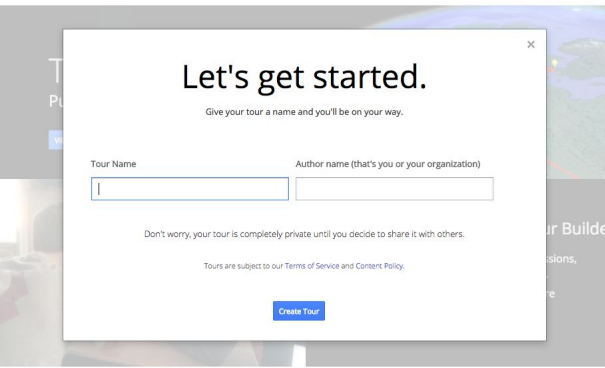
This will bring up a "Let's Get Started" window that will ask you to make some decisions.

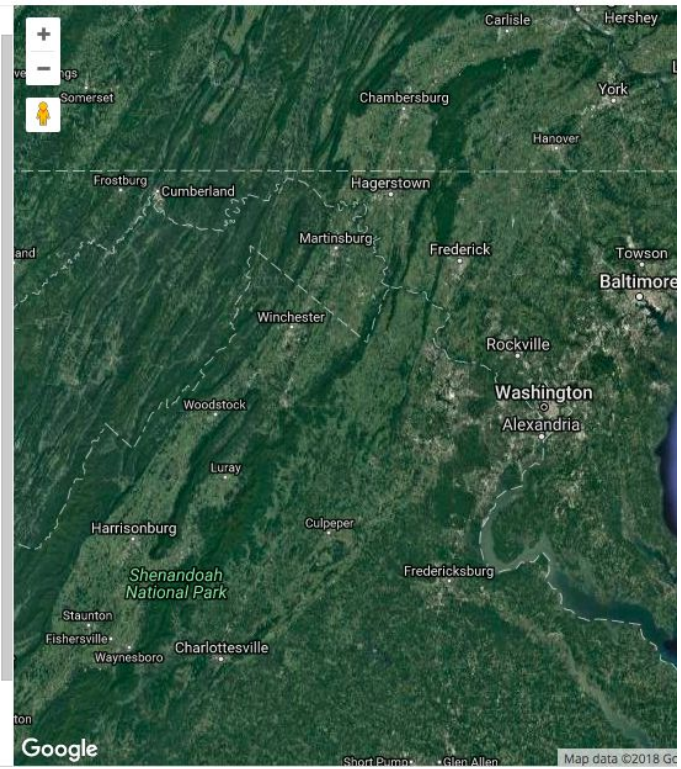

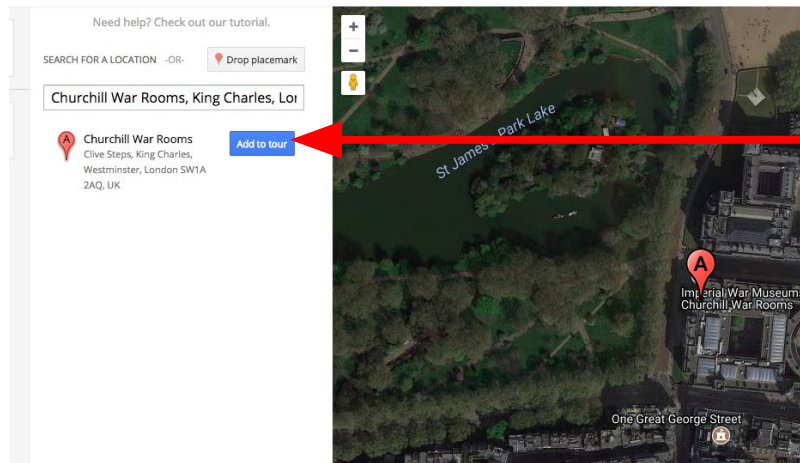

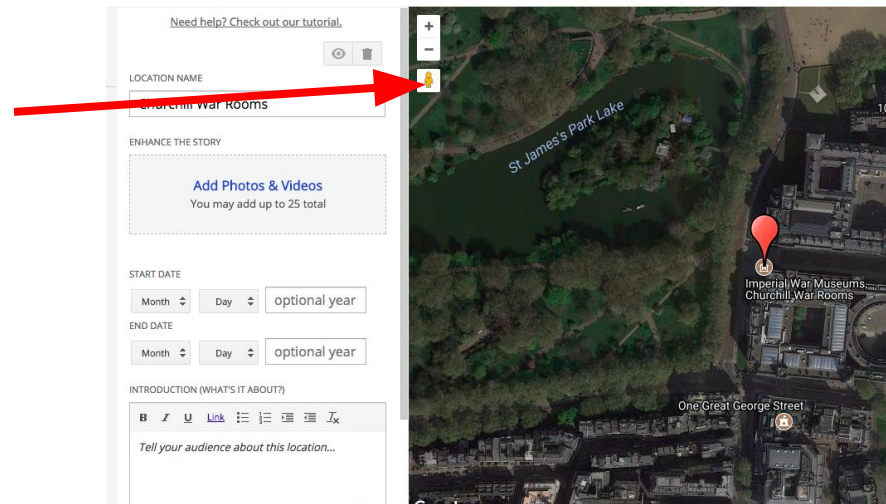
NOW...START ADDING STOPS ON YOUR TOUR!

1. Click the blue “+ Add Location” Button on the far left side of the screen and start typing in your destination.
 - a. Once you find your destination, click the “Add to Tour Button”
2. Start filling in information about your tour stops.
3. If you make a mistake and decide not to include that stop, click the trash can at the top of dashboard.



This button will add your new location. If you get stuck trying to add a location, open a new window and do a Google Search to see what locations come up related to your site.

Try it out: Click the little yellow person to try out the street view of your location. Sometimes, you can access tours and other features this way.



ADDING PICTURES

1. You can add up to 25 pictures and videos to your tour.
2. To add pictures, click the “Add Photos and Videos” box
 - a. If you already have images or videos, there will be a + in the bottom left corner of the box for you to click instead
3. Upload your images
4. Add captions to help explain your additions
 - a. Add captions using the pencil icon on the bottom right corner of the box after you have added images/videos

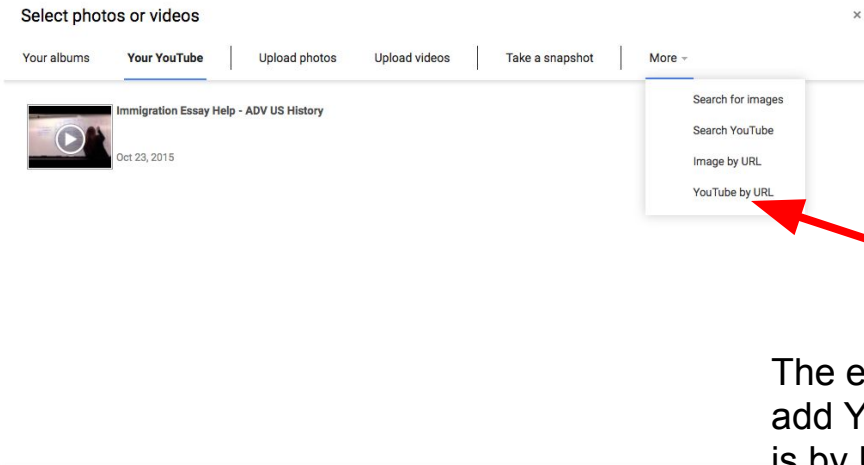

ADDING YOUTUBE VIDEOS

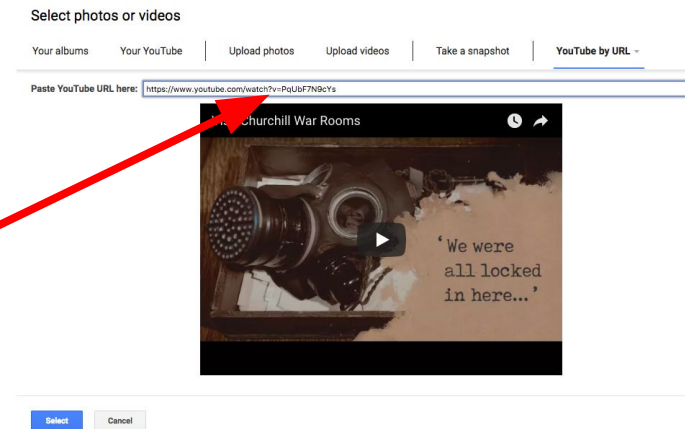
1. Follow the same basic steps to add pictures, but then choose the “More” tab in the upload window.
2. Choose YouTube by URL and copy/paste the URL into the box

ADDING LINKS TO YOUR TEXT

1. If you want to add a link to the text of your Location Description (say to a museum website or Wikipedia site), this is easy.
2. Highlight the text, and click the “Link” button at the top of the text window.
3. An “Edit Link” window should pop up, where you can arrange the details of the link.

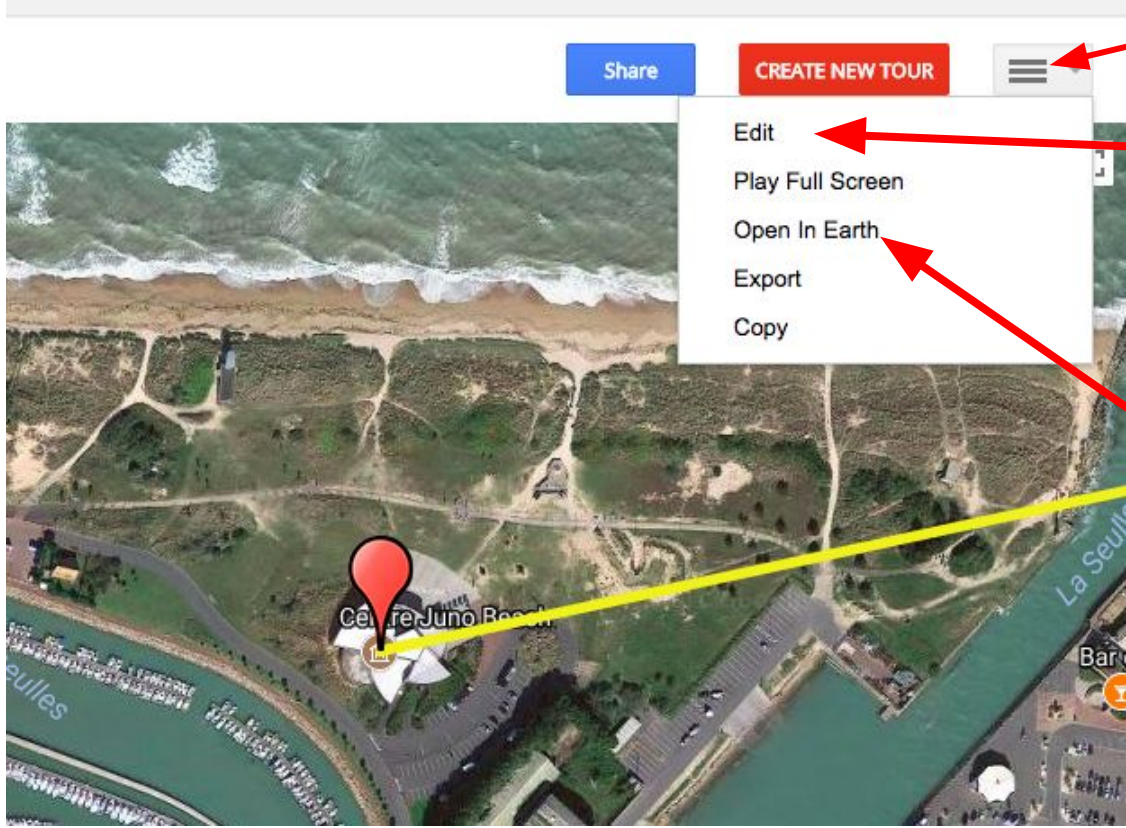

- GENERAL TIPS
 - WATCH THE “SAVE” FUNCTION. IF IT GIVES YOU THE OPTION TO SAVE, DO IT. THE AUTO-SAVE DOES NOT ALWAYS WORK.
 - YOU CANNOT CHANGE THE ORDER OF YOUR PICTURES, VIDEOS, AND MAPS ONCE THEY ARE ADDED, SO IF YOU HAVE A PARTICULAR ORDER YOU WANT THESE THINGS TO APPEAR IN, KEEP THAT IN MIND.
 - YOU MUST TAKE YOUR TOUR OFF OF PRIVATE TO OPEN THE TOUR IN EARTH (TRUST ME, YOU WANT TO OPEN THE TOUR IN EARTH, IT LOOKS MUCH BETTER!)
